

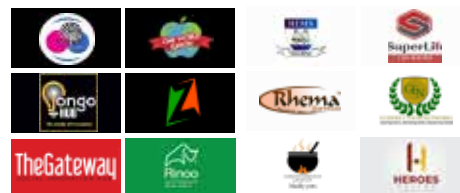

Our Compelling Why

Bolifamba is a local community in the South West Region of Cameroon, one of the most affected by the current Anglophone crisis. School has not been effectively operational since 2016. The implications are far-reaching huge as the future of the next generation is hugely endangered. This is a cause for concern because Education is the cornerstone of every thriving community or society.

In 2020, we ran ‘The Restore Her Dignity Campaign’ which has as mission to equip young girls to lead. Royalty world in partnership with The Yanou Foundation, Rinoo Cameroon and Rhema foundation have been reaching girls with Menstrual Health Education, and also providing leadership trainings for their personal development. In our Outreaches, we discovered how deeply hopeless our communities are. The crisis has separated a plethora of families. Many have lost their jobs. Even more concerning is the fact that most young girls are idle; and are potentially at risk of teenage pregnancies, and rape. This is seemingly worsened by the lack of vision and the absence of a sheer desire to go back to school.





Most youths have been so discouraged, and now the common slang in the community is **“School Na Scam,” meaning, going back to school is totally pointless.** We have been working hard to change this mindset to **“Education Na Gold”, Education is Gold.** We believe that we can restore hope even in times like these.

We set two Key objectives

1. Running a Back to School Campaign to educate at least 40 youths; the priority beneficiaries being girls.
2. Setting up a Youth Community Centre to provide short courses and educate those with talents and trades who cannot pursue formal Education; The Royalty Coaching Academy.



Overview of 2020/2021

We are super excited to report that 34 students were enrolled in school this year: 28 girls and 6 boys, 5 in Primary School, 24 in secondary and High School, and 5 in Professional Universities.

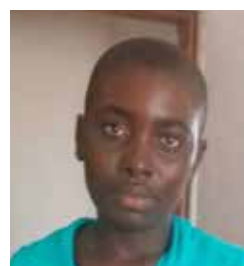

Our life and Career Parents

Our vision is to create and build extended family relationships, giving people who desire to support a girl or a boy an opportunity to hold their hands and walk with them through their life journey. This is the more reason why we desire to see our partners as life and career parents who apart from the laudable gesture of paying their fees and buying school supplies, can also connect with the students beyond that, and mentor them through their careers. Ideally, we desire to have sponsors who will take the students through till university and beyond.

We have partnered with 10 International and local organizations (One World Tuition USA, Four Corners Ministry USA, Chembonuh Foundation USA, Heroes Nation Nigeria, Super Life, MADDY POTS Canada, and Rinoo Belgium, Godfrey Esoh Network (GEN), Global Entrepreneurship Corps, Bluemoon Consulting) and about 4 individuals who have partially committed to support close to 20 students in School at all levels, primary to University.

One of the most inspiring partnership stories we have come across is about two young brothers (Tony and Emille Ndikum; who reside in the U.S - Denver, Colorado) who sold 'Chin-Chin' over Christmas to help 2 young girls (Tracy and Elizabeth) return to school. This is transformation in every sense of the word.



Equipped for Transformation

Our approach is Holistic education and throughout the year we engage the scholars in transformational leadership trainings and experiences. The key is to help them think of community solutions, we inspire them through capacity building seminars and community outreaches. Personal development is crucial as we organize sessions every month to help them grow holistically.

This school year we had:

Holiday Skill Development Academy

Girls had eight weeks to develop life skills, transformational leadership and craft. Different partners coached them to develop personally and economically.

Career Discovery Day September 5th 2020:

A day we set aside to direct our students and adolescent girls to guide them make informed career choices. It was also the graduation ceremony for their Holiday Skill Academy organized from July- August 2021.



Fundraising and Launch of the Scholarship Program October 29th 2020:

To commemorate the 40th Anniversary of the visionary Aunty Doris Ngum, as we launched the scholarship program through a fund-raising event. This event gathered over 50 friends, family and well-wishers of Royalty World.

Christmas with Dignity reach out to 2 vulnerable families, December 23rd 2020

We believe that we are all blessed to be a blessing. It is in our culture to organize Love Reach Outs to extend love to families who otherwise would not have a bright Christmas. This time, it was led by the scholars. They collectively contributed towards the purchase of love gifts for other kids, spent time with them in cleaning and decorating their houses for Christmas. The Love Reach Outs ended with giving the kids a once-in-a-lifetime experience through a movie night at the Buea Shopping Mall.



Work to school Program December 2020- January 2021

The fundamental trait of a transformational leader is self-reliance. This program was initiated to enable the students at tertiary levels augment their transportation fair. Through partnership with our technical partner Rinoo Cameroon, the students participated in the pad production process.



IDP Reach out, February 11th 2021

When transformation is holistic, it overflows from individuals to their families. The IDP reach out organized by Team Valentines Manchester, and executed by Royalty world was aimed at sharing love with some 14 internally displaced persons within the Bolifamba community (some of whom were relatives of the scholars). The beneficiaries left feeling loved and cared for each with at least a sack of household supplies.

International Women's Day Celebration, March 2021

This session was executed in partnership with MIVEG Foundation. Areas discussed were gender - based violence, purpose discovery, and a chat with sisters. Guiding them to identify their purpose creates in them a sense of direction, focus, and hope.

Easter celebration 17th April 2021

As children grow into adolescents, they start asking questions like 'who am I?' The team shared over popcorn with the scholars about the unconditional Love of God, where we originate from and how to grow in intimacy with God. It was a time for them to bond with one another and grow in their knowledge of God.

Mom, Daughter Hangout May 28th 2021

To Commemorate the International Menstrual Hygiene Day, the Mom Daughter Hangout was organized by Royalty World, Plan International, CHORDO and other partnering organizations. In attendance were scholars and other adolescent young girls together with their mothers. Focus **areas of discussion** were Mastering and calculating periods using menstrual beads, and Effective parenting skills. It was a time of bonding between mothers and daughters. The mothers saw the need to be intentional about creating healthy relationships with their daughters.



Parents Forum, Friday, 5th August 2021

In attendance were 9 parents and about 21 scholars. This meeting was organized to serve as an open platform for discussion and evaluation of the scholarship programme. The challenges faced throughout the year were discussed, and possible solutions were suggested. The parents and scholars had the opportunity to express their gratitude to Royalty World.

Mr. Ajang Nicholas took the floor in such dramatic and awe-inspiring fashion as he emphatically encouraged the students not to be swayed or distracted by the fleeting pleasures of the world

Transformation Stories

Here are transformation stories of two outstanding students from the 2020/2021 scholarship program

- **Blessing** transformed by love enrolled into form one without a First School Leaving Certificate (FSLC); but felt she could be better and decided to move to form two a few months into the first term and excelled with an annual average of 16.6/20 ...



My name is **Blessing Ntu**, I am in Form 3. I live with my mom, and two siblings. My father died when I was 5 years old, and a year later I lost my elder sister. So, for 3 years I lived with my grandmother and later started living with my mother in Molyko - Buea. 2 years later, my mother moved to Mile 16 Buea (into our grandparent's house) where we currently live.

My parents and I have been living from hand to mouth for a number of years and could barely afford my basic needs. For over 3 years, I was out of school until one fateful day my grandmother told me about Royalty World organization. I have always dreamt of being a lawyer so I can defend the innocent give back to my community but I had lost hope and never imagined I could ever go to school again. Thanks to Royalty World, I returned to school last academic year (2020/2021).

Before the scholarship opportunity, I had been out of school for 3 years, and had not yet written the First School Leaving Certificate. However, I was confident I could make it in form one. Through the programme, I was enrolled into the prestigious St. Benards Secondary school. One term into the school year, I requested to go to form two. With guidance from Royalty World, I had an annual average of 16.6/20 average and I was in the 3rd position.

I am sincerely grateful Royalty World and her sponsors for this initiative. It has really changed my life because at first, I used to talk to people rudely and I was not going to school but now I am respectful, kind, polite and I now go to school.

I feel reassured that I can still become a lawyer!!!



Priestly, one of our scholars emerged as best Student in Accounting Nationwide at the Higher National Diploma ...

My name is **Ngwa Priestly**. I am 21 years old and I hail from Bafut Sub-division in the Mezam Division, North West region, Cameroon. I am an Accounting student at the HIGHER INSTITUTE of MANAGEMNET STUDIES (H.I.M.S) Buea, South West Region, Cameroon.

I am the first child to my parents and have a junior sister. I was literally raised by my grand-mum and only visited my mum during summer holidays in Douala, Cameroon. My parents are separated and my mum has been the sole care giver and provider to my sister and I.

Due to the anglophone crisis, I had to move to Douala from Bamenda; which made me lose an academic year. While in Douala, I lived with my mom and was enrolled in a nearby secondary school where I obtained my General Certificate of Education Board - Advanced Level.

I was discovered by ROYALTY WORLD in 2019 who is sponsored my studies at (H.I.M.S) Buea. I joint this program in the 2020/ 2021 academic year and have grown tremendously. I have experienced growth spiritually, socially and intellectually. I love the family culture which Royalty instills in us.

Due to encouragement, persistent support, affirmations and love shown to me by Royalty World, I succeeded with a distinction as the best Accounting student nationwide at the Higher National Diploma (HND) 2021 session.

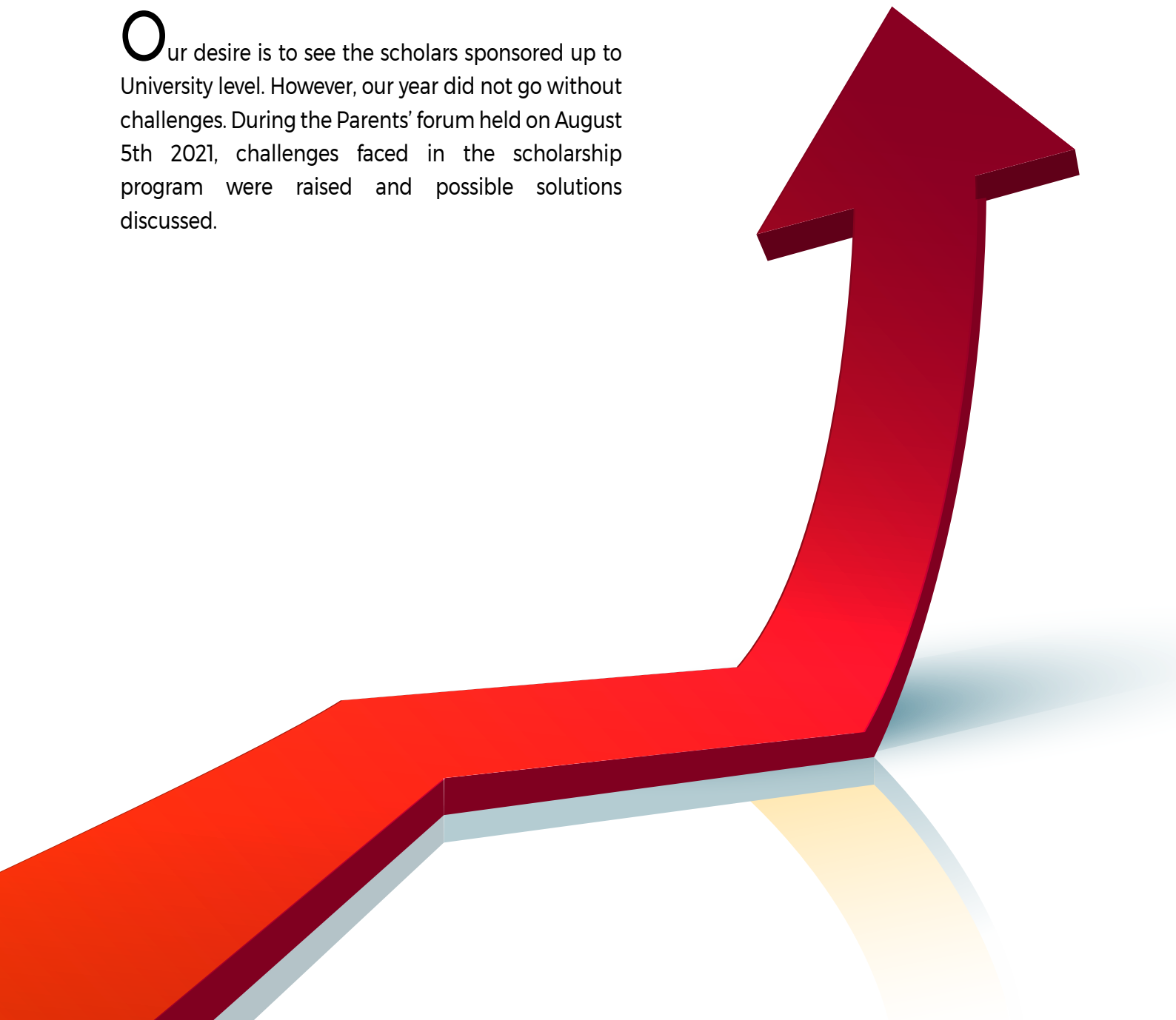
The journey has not been easy but thank God, through the mentorship offered alongside the scholarship, I have been transformed into the man I am today.

The Journey; Observations & opportunities

Our desire is to see the scholars sponsored up to University level. However, our year did not go without challenges. During the Parents' forum held on August 5th 2021, challenges faced in the scholarship program were raised and possible solutions discussed.



Along the school year, some of the students dropped out of school. This can be attributed to the fact they were not committed to the monthly forums, so were easily derailed by their peers.

Some of the students who were still part of the scholarship programme recorded poor academic performances. Upon investigation, the team realized most of the students are weak in Mathematics and can't neither read nor spell properly.

Again, there was yet another challenge in completing the fees of some scholarship students because some of the funders pulled out of the programme as a result of the pandemic.

Generally, parents within the Bolifamba community have little value for education. They often involve their kids in domestic and commercial activities during school periods. This makes them have less time for studies and the monthly meetings; translating into poor academic performance.

Opportunities

As a prerequisite to having their children partake of the scholarship programme, all parents/guardians will have to fill and sign a Commitment Form prepared and issued by Royalty World so that they can fully commit to the programme.

In order to improve students' overall academic performance, we designed a 3-week holiday classes (with focus on English and Mathematics) for the scholarship students in Secondary school – holding Tuesdays to Fridays from 2:00 – 5:00pm.

To have a more participatory and inclusive scholarship scheme, there shall be a Parents' forum thrice in each Academic year (September, January and June) to evaluate and assess the performance of the students and the effectiveness of the scholarship programme.

In addition, Royalty World would plan and provide updates (to parents and students) in advance concerning her upcoming programme.

A comprehensive mentorship program alongside a detailed calendar of activities shall be developed to foster personal and career development for the scholars.

In her own significant way, Royalty World is advocating for sponsors to adopt students as their life and career parents in order to ease the payment of fees and have a more cordial and mentoring relationship with the students.

Shaping the Future

In the academic year 2021/2022 we hope to;

- 1** Provide full and partial scholarship opportunities to 40 students (10 boys, and 30 girls; 5 in primary school, 25 in secondary school, and 10 in University) within the Bolifamba community.
- 2** Provide comprehensive life and career mentorship for 40 students within the Bolifamba community.
- 3** Organize remedial classes to help improve the academic performances of secondary school scholarship students within the Bolifamba community.
- 4** Secure effective life and career parents for every student on the scholarship programme.

We therefore believe to change communities; having the urgency to create an environment where people are able to reach their full potential, experiencing total wholeness through a transformation inside out.



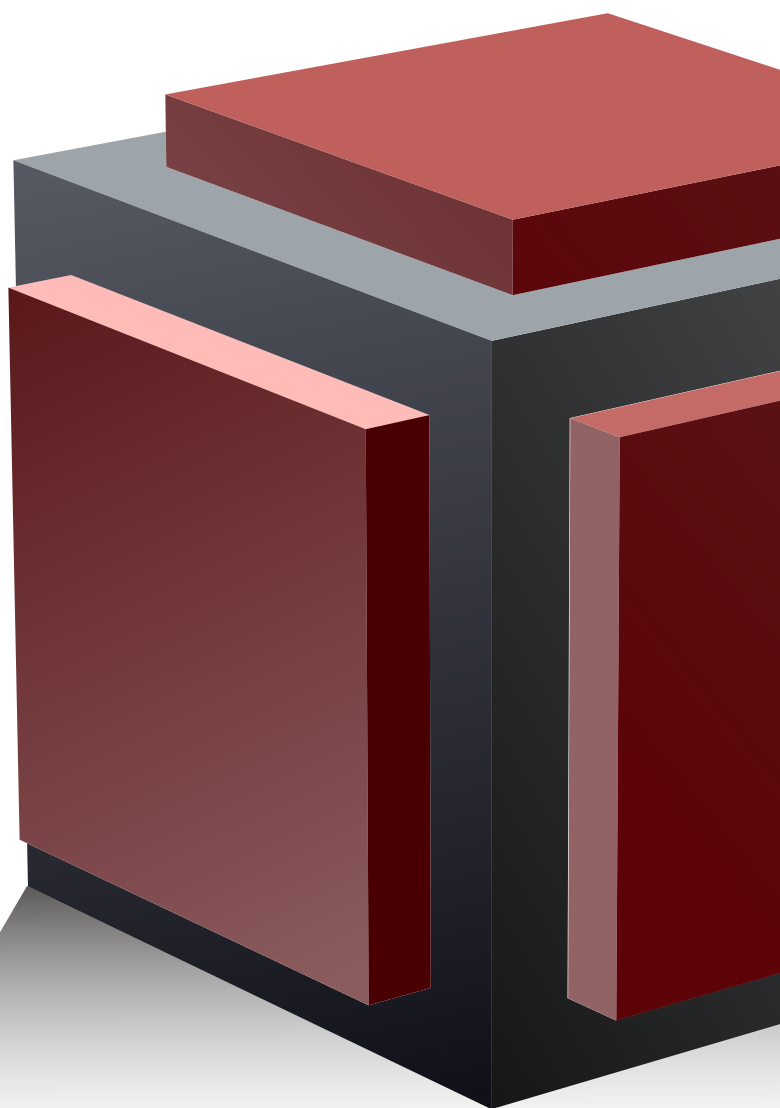
Our 4-fold Assignment:
